




How to upload MyGuide Chrome Extension to the Chrome Web Store


Step: 01

Go to <https://chrome.google.com/webstore/>




Step: 02

Click "Sign in"




Step: 03

Log into Google Admin account




Step: 04

Click the gear cog icon




Step: 05

Step: 06


Click on "Add new item"






